Australia's OKA at Beaver Pt. Hall Saturday

Ganges, Salt Spring Island — Australia's OKA are coming to Salt Spring for a fundraising dance on Saturday August 21st. The show starts at 8 pm at Beaver Point Hall, and promises to be an uplifting evening of dancing and community for all ages to enjoy.

The OKA signature is a smooth hi-fidelity sound that is full of beautiful melodies, tones and textures, cooked over raw didgeridoo rhythms and fat dance driven grooves.

A live collective where no two gigs are the same, the OKA flavor is their own hybrid of feel good Roots, Reggae, Dub and Jazz.

Woodwinds and strings are provided by Chris Lane, who mixes in bamboo fllutes and lap steel with traditional guitar riffs and soaring sax solos. Percussionist Charles Zappa lays down the rhythms, with throbbing, earthy beats of tribal music for the digital

When vocalist and didgeridoo player Stu Fergie was a child, Yakin Andu elders gifted him with the nickname DidgeriStu, a nod to his prodigious skills on his chosen instrument. They must have had a gift of foresight. Now, DidgeriStu is all grown up, and his skills on the otherworldly Australian instrument are too. Fergie rattles earth and sky on his didge; he also brings the ancient stories of his people to stages across the world.

OKA have independently sold over 60,000 albums worldwide, a true testament to their ever growing appeal to people of all ages and cultures. OKAs hypnotic, high energy live performances are a spontaneous exploration into the sublime. They consistently set themselves apart as a festival crowd favourite with their originality, honesty, and passion. This summer, on their fifth Canadian tour, the combo have blown the crowds away at the Vancouver Folk Fest and at Shambhala.

"It's the kind of sound you spread the news about with an almost missionary fervor," says promoter Gary McNutt. These Dishes are Delicious!!

Years ago my father and I use to take out at fresh light and fish in Lake Victoria in Uganda Africa. We would fish for Tilapia. We would bring our catch to shore, gut and clean it and cook it fresh over an open fire. Good gosh, I still remember that taste. Wow! There is nothing like it. For those of us who are not fortunate enough to go out and catch that fresh caught fish, there is the Fish Market in town, or Thrifty's, and if you have a taste for fresh crab, Well! Go down to the Government Wharf and visit with Gary and Stacy, their crab is as fresh as the day is new – and alive. They will cut and dress them right on the spot....Delicious! We are still so fortunate to live on the ocean and get fresh seafood. Here are some interesting and tasty recipes you might try.

Salmon Steak or Fillet

Melt a teaspoon of butter in a pan, (heat setting on medium) place the salmon, squeeze lemon juice over it and sprinkle with dill or parsley with two pinches of salt, add 7 tablespoon of water. Place a lid on it and turn the heat down to low to medium low – just enough to make it simmer for about 5 to 7 minutes. Serve with salad, rice or boiled potatoes.

Rainbow Trout with Almonds


Clean and wash the trout, pat dry and coat with seasoned flour. Two teaspoons butter and half teaspoon oil - Fry on one side for two minutes (heat setting, medium high) turn the trout and repeat. lemon juice over it and toss in some slivered almonds – turn down the heat to (medium low) and let cook for two to five minutes. Garnish with parsley and lemon wedges.

Cod Croquettes

- 11b cooked cod fillets,
- salt and pepper, pinch of grated nutmeg
- 1lb mashed potatoes,
- 1 egg,
- dried breadcrumbs,
- Oil for deep frying
- 1 lemon

Finely mince cod, and then mix with potatoes in a large bowl, season well with salt pepper and nutmeg. Make small round or oval shapes of the mixture. Lightly beat the egg in a bowl. Dip croquettes in the egg, then into the breadcrumbs. Heat oil, add the croquettes and fry for about 5 minutes till golden brown. Remove croquettes and drain on kitchen paper towels and serve with lemons over a bed of shredded

HE COWICHAN CONNECTION

Crofton owes it all to speculators

While he may have lacked in business sense, Henry Croft certainly had good taste. Even his Crofton wharf, all 750 feet of it, was meant to be "one of the best appointed" in the province, able to accommodate deep-sea ships with its three sets of railway tracks, and with separate slips for railcar ferry and smaller craft.

Everything – a townsite on Mount Sicker, a narrow gauge railway that was said to be an engineering marvel (read 'expensive') linking the mines to a second townsite at Osborne Bay and its state-of-the-art smelterwas built on the premise that his Lenora, Mount Sicker Copper Mining Co. would yield its riches indefinitely. More than a century after, Henry's long gone, as is his mine, his railway and his smelter. But Crofton survives.

Today it's residential a community, ferry terminal and site of a pulp mill. Shortly after the turn of the last century, it was a stubble of stumps, although buildings, some of them substantial, were quickly rising. All were being built by optimists like Croft. Among them was Henry H. Newill, newspaper editor. On Feb. 27, 1902, he wrote: "Contemporaneously with the laying of the first brick in Crofton, the Crofton Gazette to-day makes its debut in the journalistic arena; and so favourable an opportunity as the present should not be allowed to pass without a brief reference to the object, scope and policy of the publication, of which this is the first of, we hope, many regular issues."

While acknowledging the number of newspapers in "proportion to the population of the Province is unduly, almost absurdly large," there was always "room at the top". He wrote this, his first editorial, for a newspaper that would publish just 29 issues, for a'city' that did not yet exist: "Crofton to-day is a clearing, beautifully decorated and dotted with newly cut stumps. There are possibly a dozen buildings of sorts, and the mud on the streets is of a peculiarly 'sticky' type. Tomorrow-that is the metaphorical and rhetorical manner of speaking of three months hence-it will have a population of we are afraid to say how many thousand people, with numerous industries in full swing, not to mention one of the largest and most complete smelting works on the Pacific Coast-in fact, the largest north of San Francisco."

(Henry Croft wasn't the only Pollyanna in town.)

Alreadyresidentswere petitioning to have a postmaster and with H. Keast providing a daily stagecoach service between Crofon, Mount Sicker and Duncan's, there was talk of a steamship being placed on a regular run between Sidney, Crofton and Nanaimo.

All of these relied upon completion of the new smelting works which, under the direction


of Messrs. Breen, Bellinger and Fotheringham, and supervision of Joseph Bye, was expected to be "one of the most complete on the Pacific coast". As many as 60 men were employed in excavating up to 12,000 cubic yards of earth from the building site.

While every attempt was being made to buy locally-the boilers were being built by the Victoria Machinery Depot and granite and sandstone were being quarried on Saltspring Island - "a large quantity of special and very perfect machinery" had to be imported the American mining from capital, Denver. The smelter's bessemerising plant and two blast furnaces, the largest with a calculated capacity of 400 tons per day, would require no fewer than four smokestacks, one all of 125 feet high. Too, the new plant would be fully electrified.

No longer would coastal B.C. mine owners have to ship their ores at great expense to Tacoma and the Crofton plant would take the process one step further by producing blister copper instead of matte. "The works are being built so that they can be rapidly enlarged without affecting their economical working, and with the whole coast of British Columbia to draw from and increased quantities of ore

offering, there can be little doubt that the expansion provided for will be necessary at an early date." So said the Gazette, in February 1902.

The money for all of this was from the Old Country. How much Henry Croft and his backers ultimately spent in developing the Lenora Mine, building a railway to Crofton and building a smelter will never be known but obviously was substantial. And all on the blind faith that so distinguished those who invested in B.C. resources at that time. Alas, Crofton's smelter, like Henry Croft, its creator, was jinxed.





SALTSPRING SOLILOQUIES

"Why Do We Think the Way We Do?"

Why do we think the way we do? Where did the process of establishing meaning and sense in universe come from? It did not spring full bloom and complete into human awareness. It evolved.
