After months of persistant efforts to be heard and numerous protests over the the policies of the security screening for air traffic during the 2010 Olympic Games, Salt Spring Air just received the great news that they had been hoping for.

For twelve months they ran into dead ends, even when they took the case to Minister Gary Lunn, who agreed that their request was not only reasonable but necessary. The airline started to make plans to lay off personnel and park aircraft. Things looked pretty bleak, but...

Thanks to huge community support and a petition signed by over 2800 gulf islanders, accessibility to a politician that can see reason and a system that is flexible enough to make changes, they are thrilled to be able to have the required security system in place on-island. This means that they will be able to fly people to Vancouver direct and just as importantly fly visitors attending the Olympics back to the beautiful Gulf Islands. It will save money, fuel, time and potentially save lives, by not flying unnecessarily into a more treacherous flight path during the winter season.

This proves that together we can make a difference. Congratulations Salt Spring Air and Salt Spring Island for supporting each other.



A New Library - It's Up to You!

On December 5th, 2009 there will be a library referendum regarding the construction of a new building on the current site. But why should you vote "yes"? First and foremost, if you do and the referendum passes, then almost two-thirds of the costs of the project will be covered by a \$4.55 million Federal-Provincial grant, Yes, the remainder of what is needed for construction and additional operating costs must come from SSI ratepayers. But if the vote carries, the additional taxes paid to provide library services, per every \$100,000 of residential tax assessment on SSI homes, will increase by just under \$14.00 a year. If the referendum doesn't carry, that \$4.55 million grant goes "off Island". We either "choose it or lose it" and we choose it by voting "yes" and agreeing to put up our matching third of the cost.

The new 12,000 square foot building, more than twice the size of our old and decaying one, would be built to LEED Gold environmental standards. The library would be able to move out of its current building into its new home in the Fall of 2011. That new home, in addition to providing public meeting space, would have wider aisles and easier to access book shelves, greatly expanded facilities for both children and

teens, adequate working space for volunteers and staff, a proper home for the archives, and an "open air" public courtyard. For all these reasons we hope you and your friends, (whether they be property owners or resident renters who are also eligible to vote) will vote "yes" on Saturday, December 5. Or, if it better fits your schedule, vote at the advance poll, on Wednesday, December 2, at the Fire Hall. Polls are open 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM.
